

# Te Hīkoi Whakamua – Māori Strategy 2010–2013

## Ngā Putanga Mātua

1. A clear and relevant vision for Māori in the tertiary education sector
2. Robust kaupapa Māori based systems for the formulation and implementation of the vision
3. Enduring, mutually beneficial and tikanga based relationships with hapū, iwi and other Māori communities and/or organisations
4. Targeted, kaupapa Māori based communications with Māori in the tertiary sector
5. Identified mechanisms to receive information about the Māori tertiary sector and disseminate information to the rest of the sector to enable learning from Kaupapa Māori
6. Support from the Māori tertiary sector to the rest of the sector
7. Professional development and support to enable staff to operate safely in interaction with Māori
8. Buy-in from Hapū/Iwi/Māori groups and the Māori tertiary sector

## Ngā Whāinga – Goals

### Whāinga 1 Rangatiratanga

To identify Māori teachers and leaders in the tertiary education sector and provide support to enable them to achieve the best possible educational outcomes for Māori learners

### Whāinga 2 Ahu Whakamuatanga

To build mutually beneficial relationships with Hapū, Iwi and other Māori communities and/or organisations that assists them to achieve their tertiary education aspirations

### Whāinga 3 Whakawhanaungatanga

To actively encourage whakawhanaungatanga among Māori in the tertiary education sector

### Whāinga 4 Whakawhiti Whakaaro

To actively promote the discussion of issues relevant to Māori tertiary education and Hapū, Iwi and other Māori communities and/or organisations

### Whāinga 5 Rangatiratanga

To receive input from the Māori tertiary whānau about the strategic priorities for Ako Aotearoa funding allocation

## Ngā Mahi Matua – Key Actions

### Rautaki 1

1. Developing and updating a Māori tertiary education contacts database
2. Development of a database of Māori researchers
3. Actively promoting the Mātauranga Māori section of the Ako Aotearoa website to Māori in the tertiary education sector
4. Actively promoting Ako Aotearoa's Māori programmes to Māori in the tertiary sector
5. Having a presence at significant Māori tertiary education events

### Rautaki 2

1. Develop an annual networking plan that addresses building new relationships and strengthening existing ones
2. Providing forums for discussion of iwi development and tertiary education
3. Actively marketing Ako Aotearoa programmes to Hapū, Iwi and other Māori communities and/or organisations
4. Organising Māori teaching workshops in the regions to assist Māori tertiary teachers

### Rautaki 3

1. Establishing Tuia Te Ako as an annual event
2. Actively seeking for opportunities to form partnerships with other Tertiary Education Organisations.
3. Supporting other Māori tertiary events
4. Promoting and encouraging registrations and contributions to the Ako Aotearoa website
5. Maintaining regular contact with Tuia Te Ako delegates post hui
6. Maintaining representation from Te Tira Whakahaere on the Tuia Te Ako Planning committee

### Rautaki 4

1. Developing the community function of the Mātauranga Māori webpage
2. Maintaining regular contact with key tertiary educators
3. Ensuring the flow of new information from mātauranga Māori research and the TTEAs into our website
4. Structuring Tuia Te Ako to facilitate the vigorous discussion of current issues in Māori tertiary education
5. Funding research into aspects of kaupapa Māori teaching and learning

### Rautaki 5

1. Ensuring there are arrangements in place to capture the proceedings from Tuia Te Ako
2. Maintaining an annual schedule of strategic meetings with Māori tertiary teachers and leaders
3. Ensuring Māori representation on Ako Aotearoa advisory groups
4. Trialling new ideas at Tuia Te Ako

## Ngā Inenga – Measures

### Inenga 1

1. All Tuia Te Ako 2010 delegate contact details recorded in the Māori contacts database
2. Mātauranga Māori web page promoted at Tuia Te Ako 2010, in newsletters and Ako Aotearoa publications
3. Māori communications plan finalised
4. Attendance at Te Toi Tauira o te Matariki, Traditional Knowledge conference and Māori tertiary events in 2010 - 2011

### Inenga 2

1. Networking plan completed and implemented
2. Iwi educators and leaders are invited to attend Tuia Te Ako 2012
3. Iwi educators and leaders are factored into the Māori communications plan
4. A minimum of 30% of strategic meetings are with Hapū, Iwi or Pan Māori educators and leaders
5. Workshops are held in the regions to assist Māori teachers

### Inenga 3

1. Tuia Te Ako 2012 planning is underway by March 2011
2. At least one proposed partnership
3. At least one Māori tertiary event sponsorship
4. An increase in Mātauranga Māori web page registrations
5. At least one person from Te Tira Whakahaere on the Tuia Te Ako committee\*

### Inenga 4

1. Community function on the Mātauranga Māori webpage enabled
2. Strategic meetings underway by February 2011
3. Two completed reports from the MIP uploaded to the Ako Aotearoa website
4. Tuia Te Ako programme includes facilitated workshops
5. At least two research projects commissioned into aspects of kaupapa Māori teaching and learning

### Inenga 5

1. Tuia Te Ako proceedings launched
2. Māori representatives on all Ako Aotearoa advisory groups
3. Draft strategy presented at Tuia Te Ako 2010
